— D E A R F R I E N D S —

It is my pleasure to share with you some of the highlights of 2022 in this Annual Report. Thanks to the support of our funders, volunteers, food contributors, community and corporate partners, and every single one of you, we made significant strides in our mission to fight hunger and reduce food waste in the greater Austin area. For the first time, we rescued over 1 MILLION pounds of food in a single year from local grocery stores, restaurants, caterers, and farms, and redistributed it to those in need.

Keep Austin Fed community partnerships and volunteers have always been at the core of our operations to get millions of pounds of wholesome surplus food to individuals throughout our city who are in need of food assistance. Last year, we continued to not only expand on these partnerships, but also collaborated with brand new partners to grow our operations.

Here are some examples of those new partnerships:

- In September, another food rescue nonprofit, Save the Food, merged with Keep Austin Fed, bringing with them their network of food contributors, recipient partners, and volunteers. Their experience with food giveaways direct to communities (a.k.a. “pop-up pantries”) jump started this program within Keep Austin Fed, allowing us to reach even more individuals where they live and work. The merger of our two organizations was facilitated by the guidance and financial support of Austin Together – an organization that helps to build sustained collaborations that strengthen the collective impact on our community.
- Also in September of last year, we cut the ribbon on our first walk-in cooler! Having cold storage space that is accessible to our volunteers 24/7 allows for food rescues that are outside of the normal hours when most of our partner organizations are able to receive food. It also allows us to tailor our food distributions to better fit the needs of our partners in terms of volume and cultural appropriateness of food. We have to extend a huge thanks to Vox Veniae Church and Vesper for allowing us to use their space, and to JP’s Peace, Love, and Happiness Foundation for not only funding much of the project but also for making the connection for us. We look forward to the growth of this partnership to further serve the surrounding community.

CLOSING THE GAPS.

WE COLLECTED DATA FROM INDIVIDUALS WE SERVE TO IDENTIFY GAPS & IMPROVE HEALTHY FOOD ACCESS THROUGHOUT AUSTIN.

- With a year of pro bono assistance from The Mach 1 Group, we amped up our public relations and outreach efforts, raising awareness and education about food waste and hunger through multiple media channels, school visits, and community events.
- Working with a grad student through the CONNECT Program of the RGK Center for Philanthropy and Community Service at The University of Texas at Austin, we began a 3-semester project to aggregate and analyze new and historical data regarding the populations we serve. The goals of this project are to identify gaps in service and to drive recommendations and decision-making to improve equitable food access.

Looking ahead, we remain committed to building a more resilient and equitable food system in our community. We recognize that the challenges we face are complex and multifaceted, but we are committed to working collaboratively with all stakeholders toward a hunger-free Austin.

Once again, none of this would have been possible without the generous support of our donors, volunteers, and partners. We are grateful for their unwavering commitment to our mission and their dedication to helping us fight hunger and reduce food waste. Thank you for your support of Keep Austin Fed. We look forward to continuing our work together in the coming year.

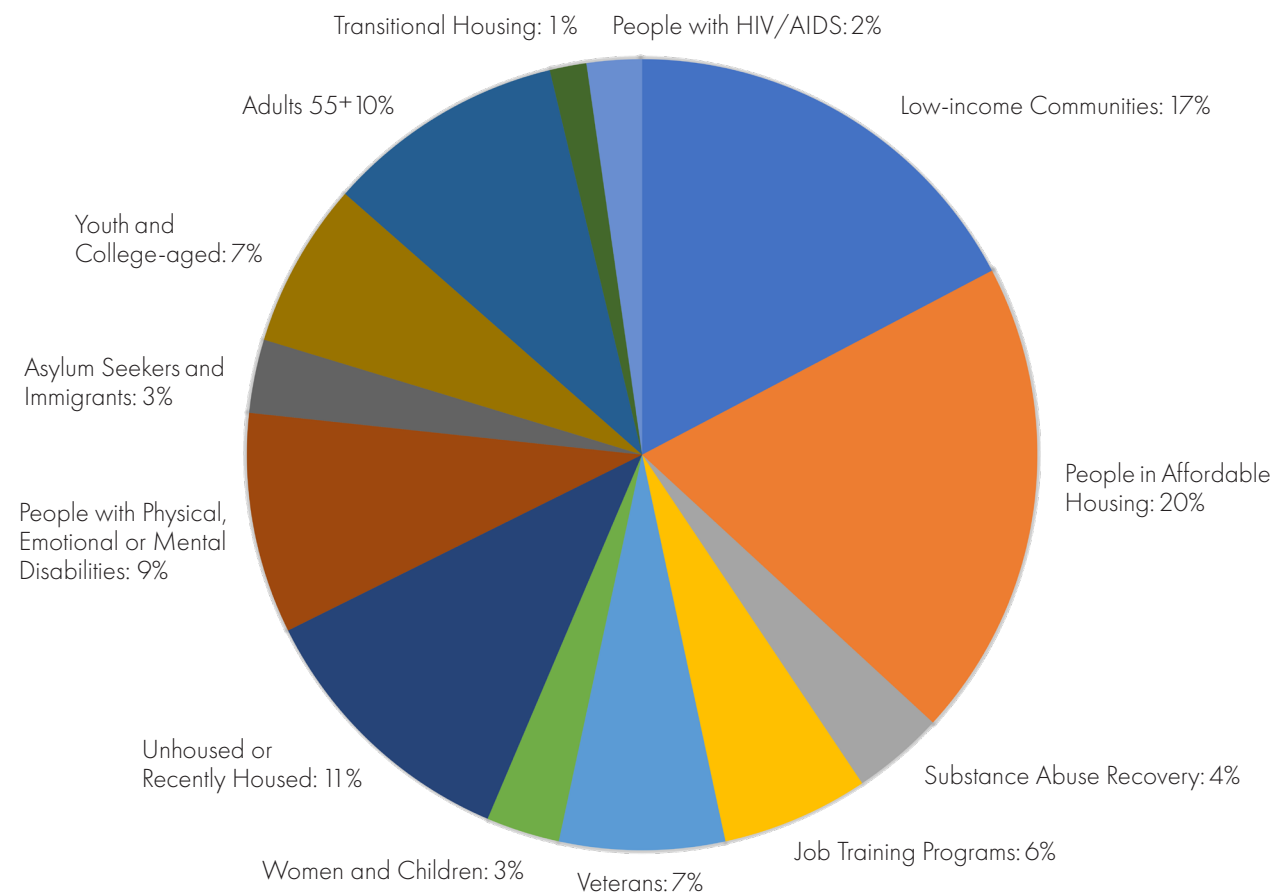

PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS**



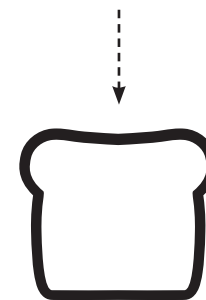

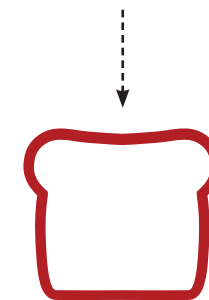
